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Criteria for schools to refer to the SLT Service for assessment

Please check that a pupil meets these criteria before completing a Universal Therapies referral form. It is very important that you list the interventions / support (e.g. Attention Autism, Language Enrichment Groups - LEGs) which a pupil is currently receiving in the **Communication & Attention** section of the Universal Therapies referral form.

The pupil must meet the essential criteria for the referral to be accepted.

Essential:

- The child attends a school in Newham and / or has a Newham GP
- The child has not been assessed by an SLT within the last 6 months
- The child is not currently managed by an SLT from LCIS
- The child's speech, language, and communication needs (SLCN) are impacting significantly on their social, emotional, and learning development
- The child has already received universal and targeted school-based interventions to support their SLCN. This intervention may have been previously recommended by an SLT or independently introduced by the school SENCo
- The referral is being made for specialist assessment, not specialist intervention

Additional:

- The child needs SLT assessment to support a referral to CHAND
- The child needs SLT assessment to support a referral to CAMHS
- Where a child is known to an Independent SLT working in school, please would you
 provide details of current input and state clearly what you would like our service to
 provide in addition to this.

NB: For children where their language and communication difficulties are affecting their learning and social interaction in the school context, we have requested that GPs ask parents to speak to the school SENCo/Inclusion Manager rather than the GP making the referral directly to us. This is to ensure that children who are already being well managed at school are not re-referred to our service. Therefore, parents may contact you to discuss if you can make a referral to our service.
