**PATIENT IS**  
**Unresponsive/Pale/Clammy/Severe Difficulty Breathing/Profuse Bleeding/Abnormal Vital Signs**

## CALL FOR HELP AND STAY WITH THE PATIENT

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GET OXYGEN / SUCTION / DYNAMAP AND GLUCOMETER		
No	Signs of Life	Yes
Start CPR		Assess ABCDE Start Oxygen : Monitor
Make sure the ambulance or crash team have been called		Call the ambulance or crash team if necessary

CPR if Necessary
30 Chest Compressions 2 Rescue Breaths Until AED Attached
Commence AED Attach pads Follow instructions
Immediately resume 30 Chest Compressions 2 Rescue Breaths
Continue until the victim starts to wake up, i.e. moves, opens eyes and breathes normally

Rapid Response Team
Designate staff to meet Crash Team/Ambulance

Modified early warning score (MEWS)  
(systolic blood pressure, heart rate, respiratory rate, body temperature) level of consciousness, AVPU.
