Question 1. Which organisation/s provide/s Independent Mental Health Advocacy for the child inpatients (aged under 18) in the Coborn Centre?

Answer: Mind in Tower Hamlets and Newham

Question 2. Does the contract with the advocacy provider/s require the provision of specific materials for children (aged under 18)?

Answer: The contract is specifically for the ELFT Coborn Unit population aged

under 18.

Question 3. How many children (aged under 18) received support from an advocate in 2017/18, 2018/19 and 2019/20?

Answer: In order to answer this question, staff would have to review each

patient record to establish whether or not they have received support from an advocate as this is not recorded separately. Therefore, the Trust is unable to comply with this particular part of your request as the cost of compliance and extracting your exact requirements would exceed the appropriate cost limit of £450 which is specified in Section 12 of the Freedom of Information Act 2000. This is based on a rate of £25 per hour, regardless of the rate of pay of any individual involved in the retrieval of requested information, and equates to 18 hours work.

Question 4. How many complaints from children (aged under 18) in the Coborn Centre and/or their parents were recorded in 2017/18, 2018/19 and 2019/20?
