**Question 1. Does the Trust have a specialist ADHD service for adults? If yes, can you give details please?**

Answer: The Trust has a specialist ADHD assessment clinic for adults in City & Hackney.

**Question 2. Once a patient is referred to Adult ADHD services, what's the target time for them to be seen for their first assessment?**

Answer: There is no specific target time for patients referred to Adult ADHD services to be seen for their first assessment.

**Question 3. Once a patient is referred to Adult ADHD services, what is the average time they are on a waiting list before their first assessment? Can you provide the three longest periods of time a patient spent on the waiting list before their first assessment in 2019 and their gender please?**

Answer: The average waiting time for a patient referred to Adult ADHD services before their first assessment is 100.67 days.

The three longest periods of time a patient spent on the waiting list before their first assessment in 2019 and their gender is below:

Female - 692 days

Female - 516 days

Male - 438 days

**Question 4. How many patients are currently on the Adult ADHD services waiting list?**

Answer: There are currently 230 patients on the Adult ADHD services waiting list.
