Request:

Question 1: Does your organisation use remote monitoring tools to help patients to manage their health and care at home?

Answer: East London NHS Foundation Trust currently has a pilot in place for Heart Failure using DOCCLA to manage their long term condition.

COVID pulse oximetry service is offered to monitor oxygen saturations.

Both of these monitoring tools are overseen by clinicians.

WHZAN has been rolled out by Bedfordshire, Luton and Milton Keynes (BLMK) for care homes residents. This allows care home staff to record baseline observations which can then be escalated to the complex care team or GP if they have any health concerns or if a clinician requests as part of a clinical assessment.

Question 2: Has your organisation extended the use of remote monitoring to utilise solutions to proactively manage the next steps of care for patients being treated in the home such as using a task management system/virtual ward*?

Answer: The Trust is currently scoping the extension of remote monitoring into:

- Virtual wards;
- Long term condition management and;
- UCR

Question 3: If yes, does the organisation use any suppliers to support the process of providing virtual wards?

Answer: BLMK Integrated Care Board have been supporting Covid pulse oximetry service.
Bedfordshire Community Health Services have provision of equipment at present but if further intervention is required the Trust would utilise DOCCLA. DOCCLA is our current provider for Heart failure.
WHZAN is utilised in care homes.
