I am responding to your request for information received 20 March 2023. This has been treated as a request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

When an organisation receives a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act, it is allowed under the Act to apply a blanket exemption to this where it has concluded that providing a response would take in excess of eighteen hours. When the cost of compliance and extracting information would exceed eighteen hours, a cost limit of £450 can be applied. This is explained in Section 12 of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 and is based on a rate of £25 per hour, regardless of the rate of pay of any individual involved in the retrieval of requested information, and equates to eighteen hours work.

Having reviewed your request, the Trust has noted that it would not be able to provide all the information requested within the 18-hours specified in the Freedom of Information Act 2000. When the Trust identifies that the request is likely to take over 18 hours, we are not obliged to provide information for any part of the request. However, in this instance and in order to assist you, we have provided a partial response to your request as per below.

In order to assist you with your request, I have advised below the timing each question would take in order to assist you to refine your request. If you wish to refine your request to comply with the 18-hour time limit, please do get in touch.

Answer: East London NHS Foundation Trust.

Answer: The Trust has four mixed-gender wards for older adults and two for CAMHS.

Question 3: How many communal areas does your trust have which can be accessed

by all sexes?

Answer: All mixed sex wards have dedicated female lounges, and would have a mixed

sex lounge, allowing individuals to make a choice about where they want to

spend their time.



To clarify there is no particular category of incidents on Datix, sexual or otherwise, that identifies incidents 'serious enough to be referred to the police'. Datix identifies four main categories of sexual related incidents. Including; Sexual Abuse, Sexual Aggression and Sexual Behaviour / Activity, these are the categories against which this response was formulated. Therefore, to respond to this question all the incident categories under the aforementioned 'sexual' related categories will need to be individually reviewed to identify the nature of the incident and whether the incident was considered serious enough to refer to the Police.


