EEG




EEG is the name commonly used for electroencephalography. EEG is an important test for diagnosing epilepsy because it records the electrical activity of the brain.

It is safe and painless.



At home







• Eat some food.

- Take your normal medications.
- Bring a list of medications with you





At the hospital



• You will sit in a comfy chair and relax.

• You will not feel anything from the EEG.

• Wires will be put on your head with a paste.

• We will ask you to open and close your eyes.



• You may do some deep breathing



• You may look at a flashing light.



• The test will take one hour.

• When the test is finished you can go home

• Your results will go to your doctor
