

Nurses' EPMA User Guide

For <u>training requests</u>, please 'Raise a Request' through the IT Service Desk Portal. Select 'Clinical Systems Training' and then 'JAC' from the appropriate dropdown menu.

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1. Logging On

To access EPMA double click the EPMA Medicines Management icon on the desktop

Enter your unique username and password (case sensitive).

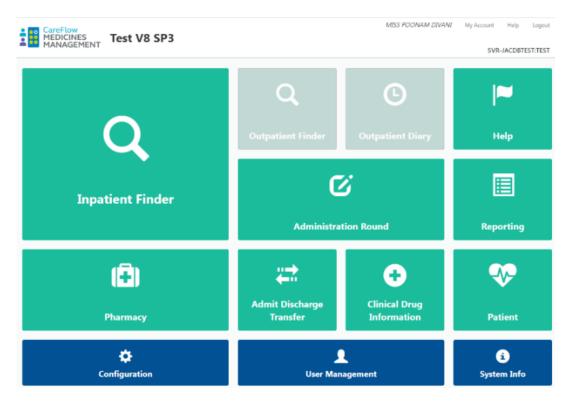


Do not share your Password with anyone else



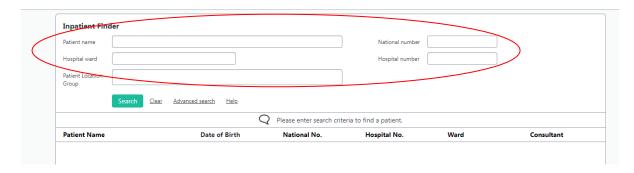


You are now logged in and will see the screen below:



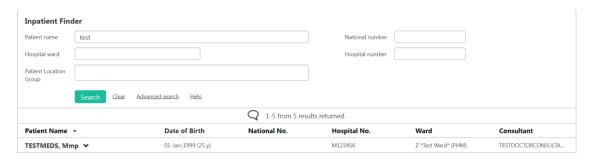
 Select Inpatient Finder, then use any of the following identifiers to find the correct patient. If you are searching by Patient Name you should type in their surname.

2. Patient Selection

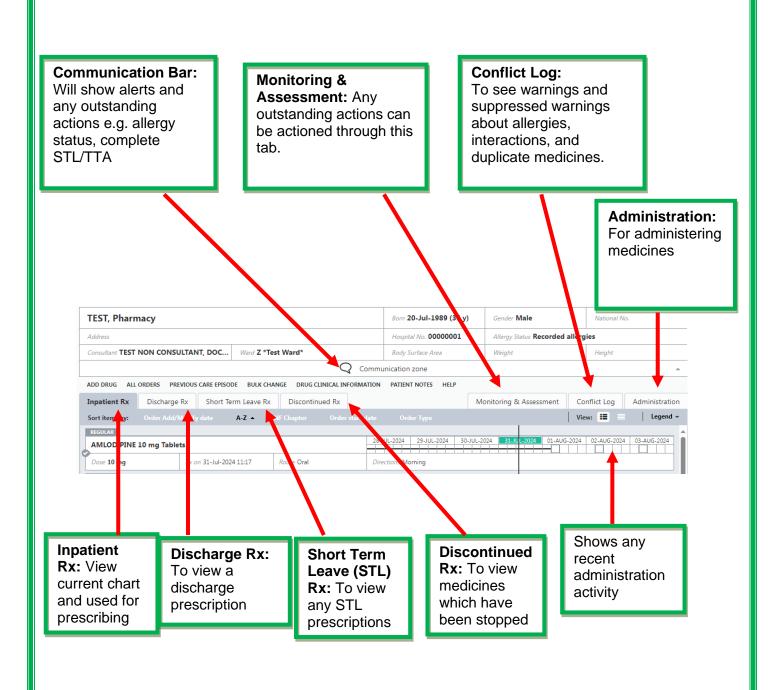


Select the patient.

NB: EPMA will warn you if patients with similar names are on the same ward. You must always check the date of birth and hospital number to ensure you have selected the correct patient.

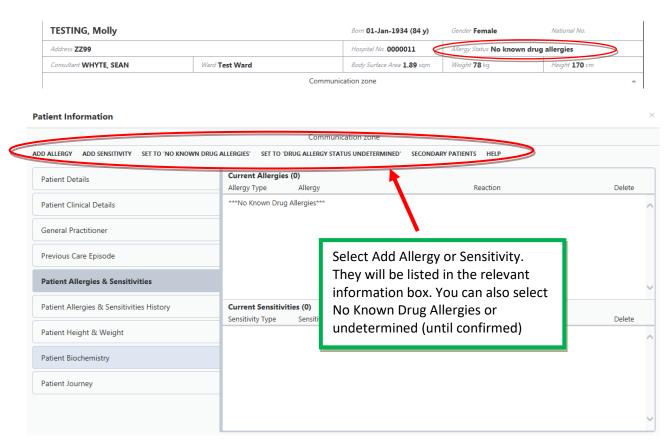


- Only patients currently admitted to an inpatient ward will appear.
- If the patient does not appear when searching please contact a EPMA Superuser or the Duty Senior Nurse out of hours.
- See below for an overview of the chart.

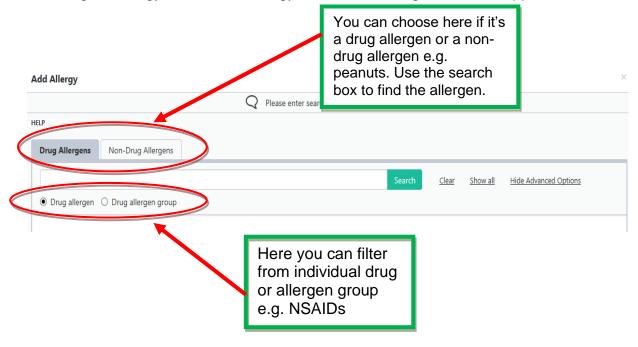


3. Adding a patient allergy & height & weight

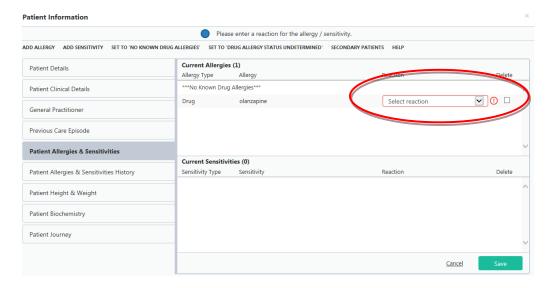
 In the patient record click on 'Allergy Status'. The patient information page will open in a new window. You can make the changes needed using the relevant options and tabs available.



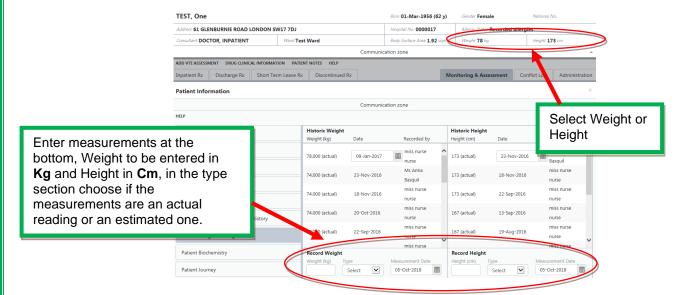
If adding an allergy, select add allergy and the following screen will appear.



On the next page select the relevant allergen from the list compiled and click select. This
will take you back to the Patient Information page. From the drop-down menu select the
reaction and press save, the allergy is now added.



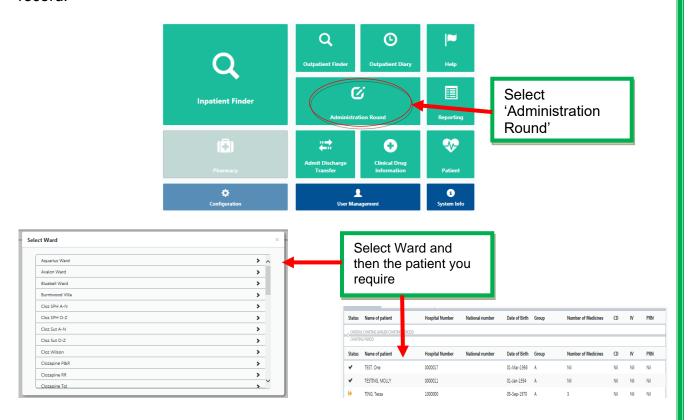
- The same process applies when an adding a sensitivity.
- You can also select 'Patient Allergy & Sensitivity History' tab to view all the previous allergies and sensitivities recorded for the patient.
- To add weight, and height see diagram below



4. Administering

4.1 To administer medication

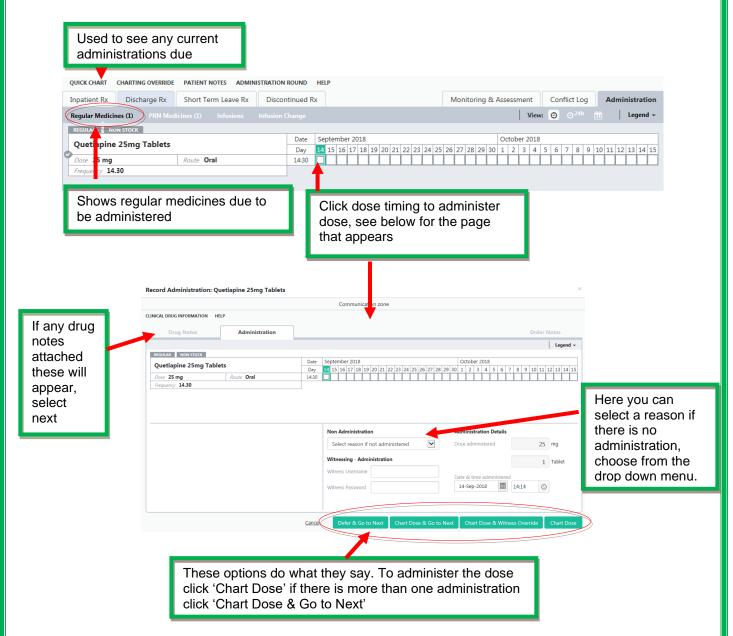
- Select Administration Round from the main menu then select the relevant ward from the list.
- Select the patient and then you will be brought to the administration page on the patient's record.



- A black tick next to a patient means that there are no outstanding administrations. A double yellow arrow means that there are medications outstanding requiring action.
- Click 'continue to chart'. If there are any notes on the patient record these will appear next. Ensure you read the notes then close using the cross at the top right hand corner.



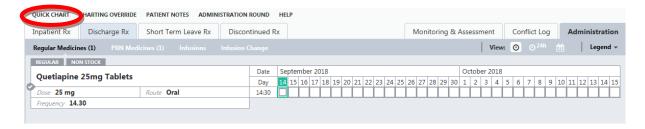
 You will then be presented with the following screen and can administer a dose by selecting the administration box as shown below.



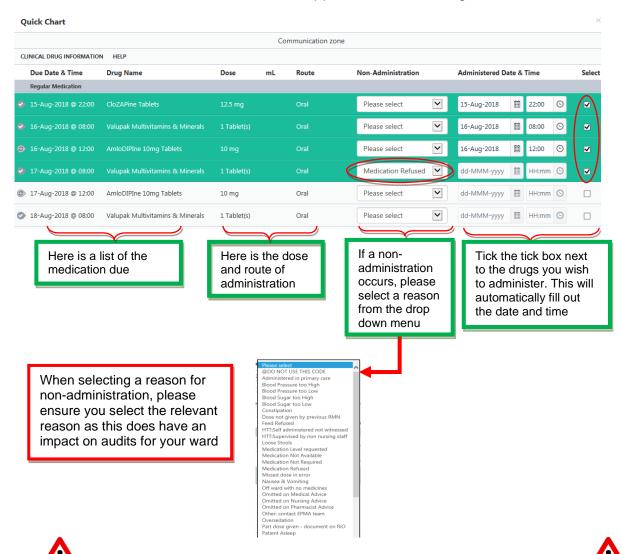
 Above is the basic way to administer a one off medication, while doing administration rounds the easiest and preferred way to administer medication is by using the function quick chart, see below on how to do this.

4.2 Quick Chart:

 Following the same process as above, once you are in the patient record, click on Quick Chart.



 The following screen will appear, it will show all the administrations due for the current administration round i.e. all AM doses will appear for the morning round.



Any drugs that have a note attached to them <u>OR</u> any high alert critica medicines will open the attached note once clicked on.

After reading the note click 'acknowledge' this will take you back the above screen.

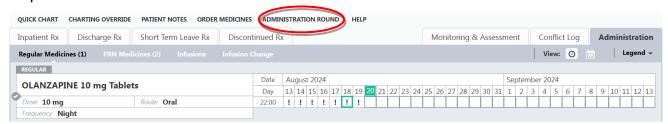
 All PRN and STAT doses will also be available to administer through Quick Chart but also can be done individually following previous administration steps (See 3.1)



Select chart to administer all the medicines you have selected



 To move onto the next patient, select administration round from the current patient's chart, this will take you back to the patient list, select your next patient and repeat the same process.



 You can also administer medicines by selecting the Administration tab within the patient record and following the same process as above without having to use the Administration Round option from the main menu.



4.3 Administering PRN Medicines

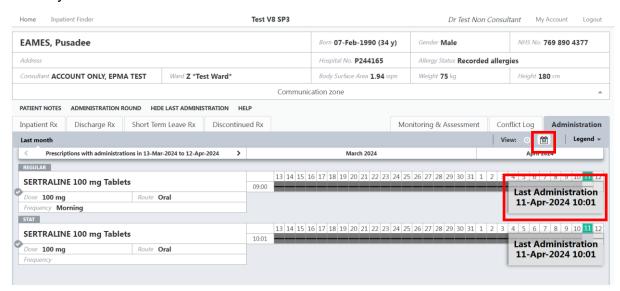
- To administer PRN's use one of the methods as shown in section 3.1 or 3.2.
- Before administering any PRN medication you must check the last dose administered along with the total maximum daily prescribed dose. To do this select administration tab from the patient's record.



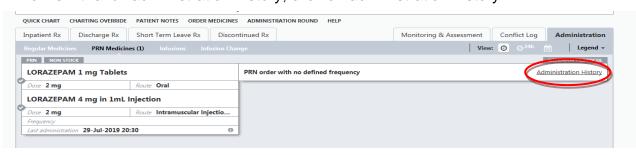
 Once in administration, directly underneath the same tab there will be a section labelled 'View'. Here you can choose to see the current charting period, the charting period for a 30 day period (you can select different months to view).



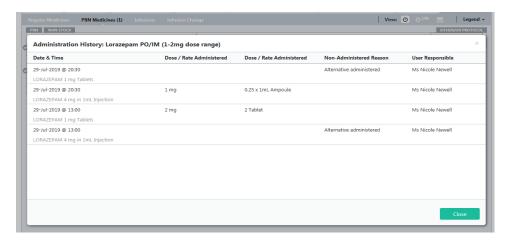
- The calendar view (or last 30-day view) has changed from a number to an 'M'
- Last administration date and time for a particular medication will be written in bold as per the screenshot below. This is particularly useful for medication such as PRNs and depot injections.
- You can view a detailed administration history of each medicine by clicking on it in the Monthly view



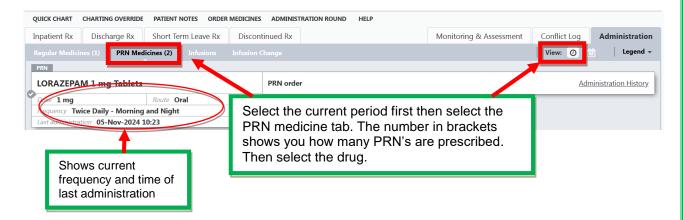
To view the full administration history, click on administration history.



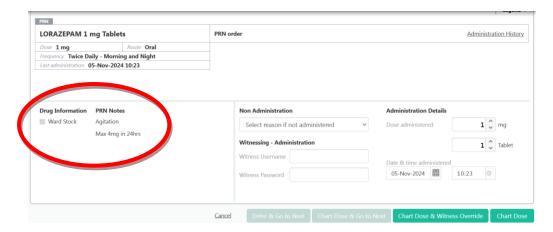
• Example of the administration history: most recent administration shown at the top:



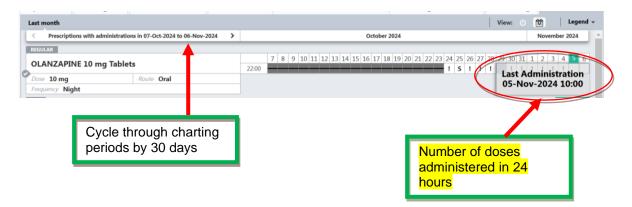
 To administer a dose click back into the current charting period, select the PRN medicines tab then select the drug you wish to administer. Here you will be able to see the maximum dose allowed within 24 hours.



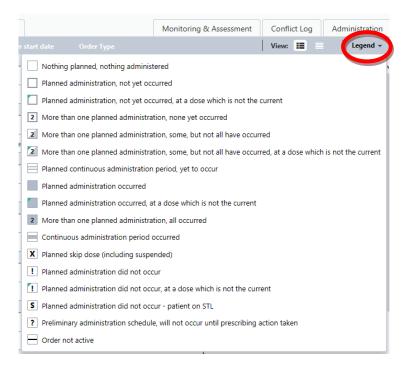
 Once in the drug you can view the maximum dose and any other PRN notes before administering the medication. Please pay careful attention to this to ensure administration stays within maximum dose.



 The 30-day administration chart will show the doses administered in numbers for the day rather than greyed out boxes. You can also cycle through the months to view the previous administration history.



To view a legend; hover your mouse over the Legend tab. This will show you the meaning
of each symbol which may appear in the administration chart.



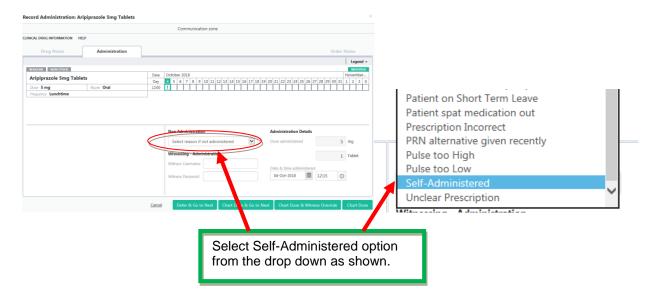


Note: EPMA will <u>NOT</u> stop you administering above the prescribed maximum daily dose for PRN medicines. Always check before administering

4.4 Self-Administration:

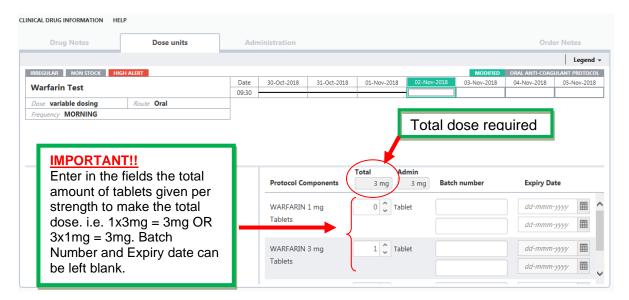
 If the patient is self-administering any medicines this should be documented by the pharmacist/doctor

• Select the 'Self Administer' option from the drop down menu of the Non Administration box and then chart the dose. This will now be recorded as self-administered by the patient.



4.5 Administering Oral Anti-Coagulants

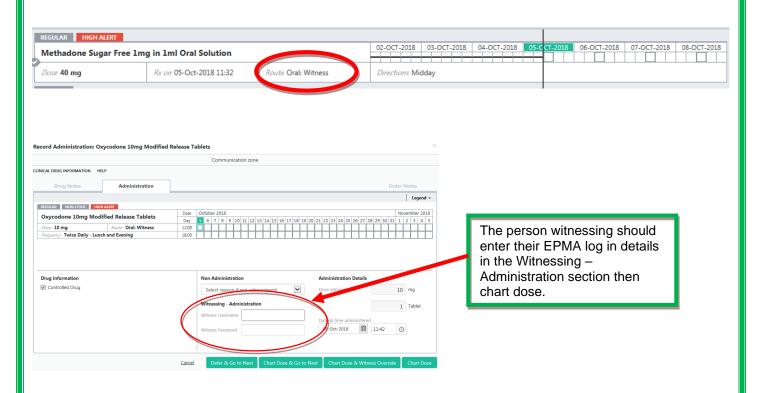
Anti-coagulants will not appear on quick chart as these are classed as Critical Medicines.
 For administration, once in the patient's chart select administration as shown previously, select the Warfarin. The same process applies however you will also need to enter the tablets you have used to make up the dose:



Click on next then chart the dose on the next page to complete administration.

5. Witnessing Administration

- Some medicines require a second person to witness the administration, e.g. controlled drugs. This could be a second nurse or pharmacist.
- This will be indicated next to the route, e.g. 'Oral: Witness' or 'Intramuscular: Witness'



6. Consent to Treatment

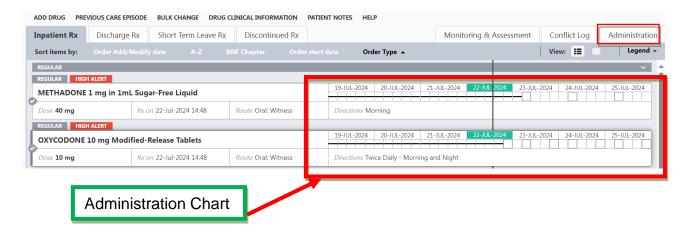
- EPMA currently has no Mental Health Act functionality; therefore any patient who has a Consent to Treatment (CTT) form in place i.e. a T2 or T3 form or is under a Community Treatment Order (CTO) will be prescribed a 'consent to treatment form'
- When you enter the record of a patient who has consent to treatment form you will see that it is prescribed.



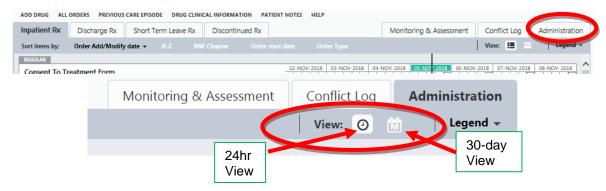
 Paper copies of CTT & CTO forms will be stored on the ward next to the EPMA computer along with any other paper documentation, where applicable.

7. Full Medicine Chart

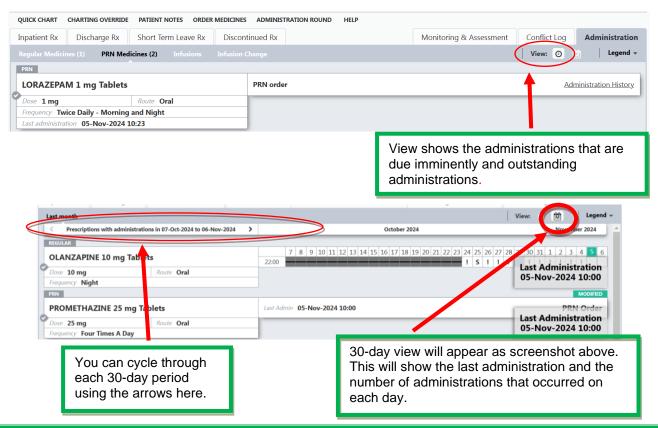
• The medicine chart is available on the Inpatient Rx page of the patient's record which shows the administration details of each drug for the past 7 days. You can use the Legend tab to see the meaning of each administration status.



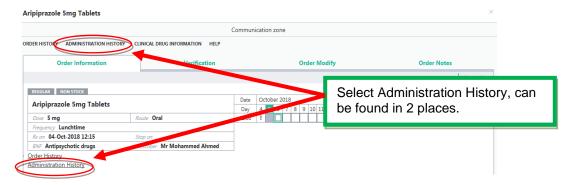
 For a view of the full administration chart, follow the process as mentioned in section 3.3 by selecting Administration and choosing either the 24hr charting period or 30-day charting period.



• Select either of the views as shown above and the following screens will appear for each view of the chart.



 For details of administration for a medicine, once in the administration page as shown earlier, click on any of the administration boxes on the drug and the following screen will appear.

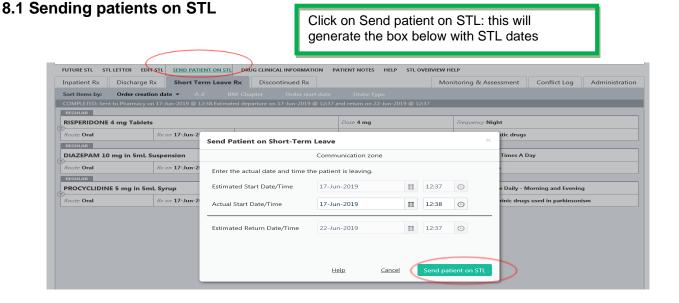


 You can now see full details of the administration which includes name of nurse, date, time, dose and administered as show below



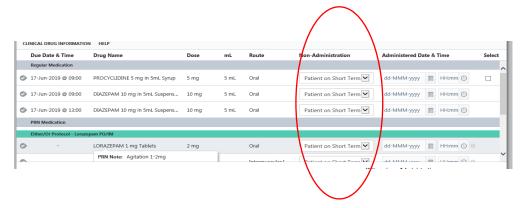
8. Checking status of prescriptions

To see if any TTA/STL's are prescribed, please use the Discharge Rx and STL Rx tabs. Please refer to the diagram in Section 2.



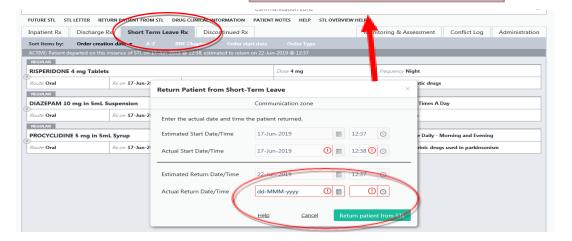
STL dates are already input: once patient has been given TTA medication click on send patient on STL -

The patient will still appear during an administration round: the non-administration reason will automatically be generated as shown below. Select and chart as shown in Section; 4.2 Quick Chart:



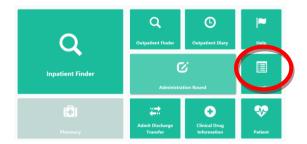
8.2 Returning a patient from STL

Select the Short term leave RX- the Return patient from STI will pop up, you will need to input the date & time

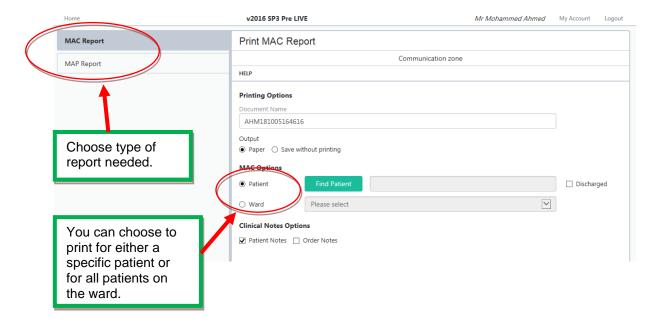


9. Printing Medicines Charts

If you need to print charts in the event of EPMA being unavailable in an emergency or when a
patient is transferred to another hospital select 'Reporting' from the home screen

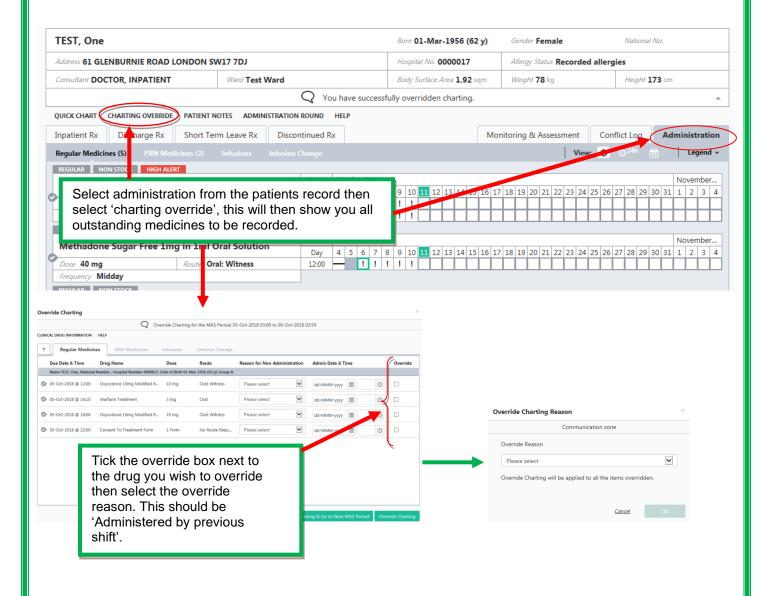


- If EPMA is not functioning or there is a power outage you will need to go to an emergency back-up device and print off charts for all of your patients.
- The **MAC** report is a chart for the next 7 days which can be printed and used as a paper chart until the system is available.
- The MAP report shows all medicines previously administered during this admission. This is
 especially important for PRN medications so the maximum prescribed dose in 24 hours is not
 exceeded.
- You must always print both reports as you will be missing vital information if you only have access to one of them.



10. Medications not documented as administered (senior staff only)

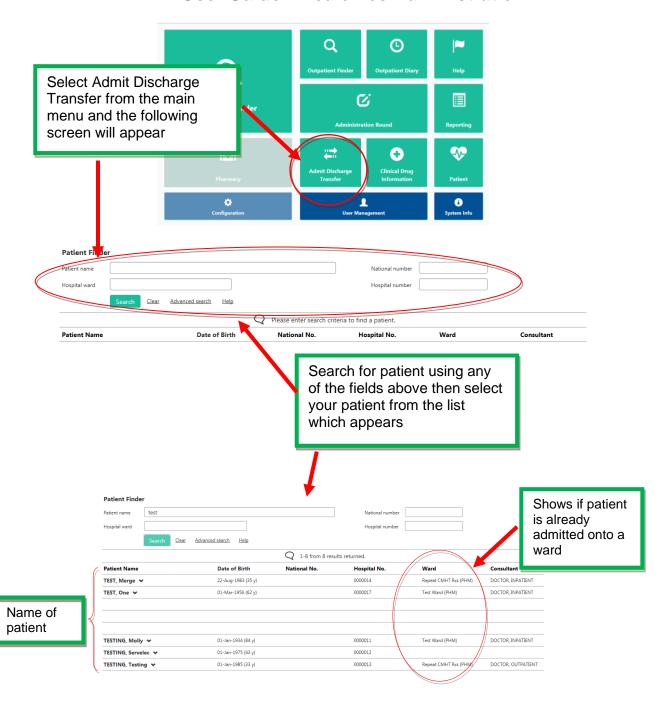
• If an administration has not been recorded, you will not be able to administer any further doses of medicines for the patient. In the first instance the administering nurse should be asked to update EPMA. If they are not available, then a senior staff member can override the chart.



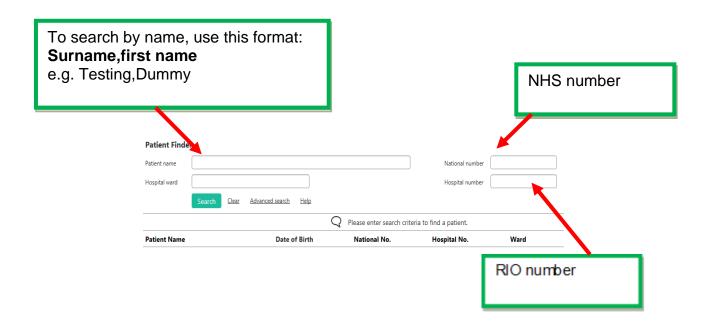
- Click override charting and the medicines will be recorded as administered.
- Instances like this should also be recorded in the RiO record.

11. Admitting, Transferring & Discharging Patients

 This will usually be done automatically then the patient is admitted, transferred or discharged on RiO. However, if RiO is not working you will need to follow the processes below:

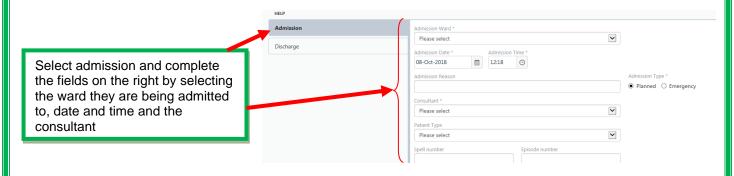


• Patients search fields: <u>Use one field at a time</u>

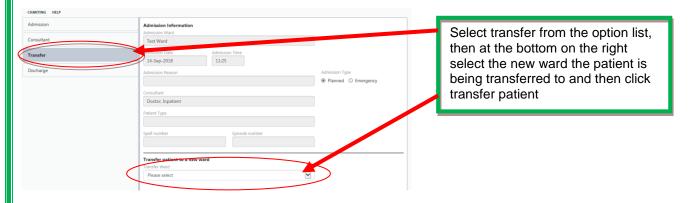


 Once you have selected the patient the following screen will appear, here you can choose from the 3 options of admitting, discharging or transferring (Transfer only available when patient is already on a ward).

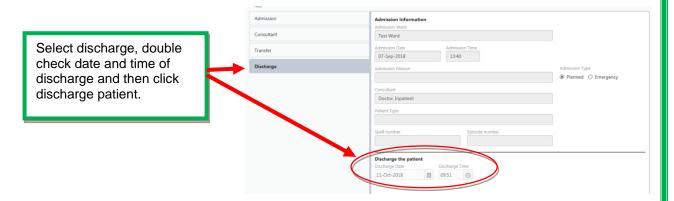
Admitting a Patient:

If you see the message 'discharge prescription in draft' check with doctor before discharging from EPMA.



For any patients already admitted on to a ward there will also be a 'Consultant' option, if you
ever need to change the consultant you can do so using this option to allocate a new
consultant.
