Answer: Yes. Waste, both clinical and non-clinical is audited annually for compliance.

This includes pharma waste. A procurement assessment, including environmental impact in the form of CO2 emissions has been carried out relating to all supply chain items within the Trust including pharmaceutical

products.

Answer: No. There is a clinical lead who has 0.5 days per week allocated to all

sustainability issues across the Trust which does include the medicines

workstream however.

Answer: This is reported every six months via the Infection Prevention Committee. It is

also reported every six months via Finance, Business and Investment Committee (FBIC) on all Green Plan matters which includes waste.

The Trust is therefore unable to provide a response. 
The Trust has reviewed question 7 of your request for information under the Freedom of Information Act (FOI) 2000.


