Answer: It is Trust policy that no bin-liners are used in areas that in-patient service

users have sole access to such as bedrooms or communal areas. They are

only used in treatment rooms and staff offices.

Answer: The Trust has reviewed question 1a of your request for information under the

Freedom of Information Act (FOI) 2000.

Section 1(1) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 states:

(b) if that is the case, to have that information communicated to them.




