> The number of mentally unwell people in your care that have died from diabetes complications from 2014 - 2024. If you do not have these records then please direct me to the government department that does if possible.

Answer: 959 mental health patients in the Trust, who have been identified with a

diagnosis of diabetes, died during the period 2014-2024.

Please note: The Trust is not able to confirm whether it is a complication of the patient's health condition that resulted in their death. The clinical codes the Trust used in their search for relevant statistics are those patients with a primary and/or secondary diagnoses of the ICD-10 code for Diabetes Mellitus

(E10 to E14).

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
