

Question 1: Do you provide continence products to patients in the community? By

products, we are referring to pads, pull up pants and bed protection

sheets NOT stoma products or catheters.

Answer: Yes.

Question 2: Do you have a criteria that patients need to meet in order to be allocated

continence products? If so please can you include this in your response.

In Newham, the aim is to promote continence and the majority of patients Answer:

attending clinic should receive a course of treatment before product provision,

and alternatives should be considered.

Products would be provided for moderate to severe incontinence that has not

improved with treatment or is unlikely to improve with treatment.

Products provided to support children with toilet training.

In Tower Hamlets, the criteria is based on the need following outcome of an

in-depth continence assessment or review

In Bedfordshire and Luton - A full continence assessment needs to be

completed. Please see Appendix 1 attached.

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Question 4: Do you have a set number of products you will supply, for example, 3 pads per day? Is there any criteria that determine this or is it a set rule for all patients?

Answer:

In Newham, there are set numbers per day however these numbers can be increased in exceptional circumstances depending on clinical need. There are different criteria for different products. For example, patients with dementia can receive a maximum of two pull-ons per day if they are unable to manage with shaped pads or washable underwear.

Bedbound patients can receive four shaped pads. However, to support patient choice, they alternatively can receive one slip for the night and two shaped pads or two slips and would need to purchase extra.

In Tower Hamlets, a maximum daily prescription of pads are three a day but can go up to four as per outcome of assessment for appropriate group of patients.

In Bedfordshire and Luton three products are supplied per 24 hours by the adult continence service for anyone over the age of 18 years.

Question 5: Do you operate a "contribution" system at all? If the answer is yes, please specify the criteria.

Answer: No.

Question 6: How many Serious incidents have you had in the past 12 months relating to continence products?

Answer: Zero serious incidents were recorded in the past 12 months.

Question 7: For children's products, at what age do you start your provision?

Answer: Newham: Five years old.

Tower Hamlets: Not applicable as they do not provide continence products for children.


Bedfordshire and Luton: Not applicable as they do not provide continence products for children.
