

Request:

Please provide the following information relating to your Trust's use of electro-convulsive therapy for the period between 1 January 2024, to 31 December 2024:

Question 1: Treatments delivered by consent status, specifically including the number of treatments given to

- a) those incapable of consenting, but ECT authorised where patient resists or objects (under Mental Health Act Section 58A), and
- b) those incapable of consenting, but ECT authorised where a patient does not resist or object (under Mental Health Act Section 58A).

If information with this distinction is unavailable, please simply provide it for the number of treatments where a patient did not consent.

Please confirm the number of patients this pertains to for this period.

Please also separate this information out by age, gender, and IMD decile (or if not possible, quintile).

Answer:

The Trust has reviewed your request for information under the Freedom of Information Act (FOI) 2000.

Section 1(1) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 states:

Any person making a request for information to a public authority is entitled—
(a) to be informed in writing by the public authority whether it holds information of the description specified in the request, and

(b) if that is the case, to have that information communicated to them.

East London NHS Foundation Trust does not record when a patient resists ECT if they were judged to be incapable. The Trust therefore does not hold this information and is unable to provide a response.


Section 16(1) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 states: Section 16 (1) It shall be the duty of a public authority to provide advice and assistance, so far as it would be reasonable to expect the authority to do so, to persons who propose to make, or have made, requests for information to it.

Under Section 16 of the Freedom of Information Act, the Trust has a duty to provide a reasonable level of advice and assistance. As such, the Trust can disclose the following information to assist you with your request.

Within the calendar year of 2024, 172 out of 397 ECT treatments were delivered with consent given. For 160 of these 172 treatments, the patient was judged to be incapable of giving consent. ECT treatment was not given to any capable patients who refused consent. This relates to 39 patients. Please see below for the number of patients given ECT, broken down by age group, gender and the index of deprivation:
