**I would like to request the following information for your healthcare Trust the period 1st Jan 2015 to 31st December 2025:**

**Question 1: Annual number of patients diagnosed with blood cancers per year overall, and by subtype:**

**Lymphomas (C81-86)  
Malignant immunoproliferative diseases (C88)  
Multiple myeloma and malignant plasma cell neoplasms (C90)  
Leukaemia (C91-C95)  
Unspecified malignant neoplasms of lymphoid, haematopoietic and related tissues (C96)**

**Answer:** The Trust has reviewed question 1 of your request for information under the Freedom of Information Act (FOI) 2000.

*Any person making a request for information to a public authority is entitled—
