This job description is for a core training post in Child and Adolescent Psychiatry, working City & Hackney CAMHS at 15 Homerton Row

Brief description / profile of Clinical Supervisor

Dr Sharon Davies is a Consultant Child & Adolescent Psychiatrist and Associate Clinical Director

The team (including staffing) / service description

The team members come from multiple disciplines with individual expertise. The team consists of: 5 Consultant Psychiatrists, 2 ST's, 2 CT's, and FY 2 and FY1 doctors. There are also clinical psychologists, psychotherapists, family therapists, Specialist nurses and a nurse prescriber and specialist mental health clinicians (including social workers and an OT)

Role of the Core Trainee (1-3) / Main Duties and Responsibilities

The post-holder will provide a clinical psychiatric service, including completing initial assessments on Young people and families in the assessment clinic and on an outreach basis, crisis assessments of young people in A&E, contribute to specialist neurodevelopmental assessments, and have a small shared case load of young people requiring medication review. Clear clinical documentation of assessments, risk assessment and communication with other agencies is expected. The trainee will learn about mental health law as applied to children and young people, including use of MHA, MCA, Gillick Competence and The Children Act.

Any other specific characteristics of this job

There will be opportunities to work alongside a range of therapists, attend family therapy clinics and attend multiagency meetings with social care and education. There are opportunities for audit and QI and there is a monthly whole service meeting with an education focus.
