A Survey of Preferences for the Arts Therapies

PhD student Emma Millard, has being doing research related to aspects of the ERA trial. Most recently, a Survey of Preferences for the Arts Therapies, which ended on the 30th October. 13 NHS sites participated and collected responses from a total of 1,541 participants including mental health service users and the general population, making it the largest arts therapies survey ever conducted in the UK. The results will tell us how many people are interested in taking part in group arts therapies, whether they have previously experienced arts therapies, which modality would be their preference and why – so watch this space!

Creative Isolation - Home-based activities

We recently stumbled across The March Network, a mental health organisation focused on the power of bringing people together with social, cultural and community assets (including art, community and social spaces). They focus on using these assets to enhance public mental health and wellbeing, prevent mental illness, and support those living with mental health conditions. In recognition of more people socially and physically distancing themselves they have created a space to share creative home-based ways to support mental health.
