Introduction & Summary

This job description is for a Higher training post in general adult psychiatry, working for the Crisis Resolution Home Treatment Team based in Luton.

The post holder will spend one year in this post, under the Clinical Supervision of Dr Seanna Eisenhandler.

The post-holder will gain experience in the assessment and treatment of acute and severe mental illness in the community, risk assessments, medical management, multidisciplinary team working, working with carers and families, and co-working with other teams inside and outside of the NHS.

There will also be the opportunity to help supervise and support other trainees within the team, QI, training medical students and other members of the MDT and in leadership and development of the service.

Brief description / profile of Clinical Supervisor

Dr Eisenhandler is an experienced clinical and educational supervisor who has been working at Luton and South Bedfordshire CRHT since 2015. Prior to this she had experience working as a consultant crisis team and CMHT psychiatrist in Tower Hamlets, East London. She has extensive training experience both as an educational and clinical supervisor, she has also worked as college tutor in both Tower Hamlets and Luton, and as Associate Director of Medical Education for psychiatry in Luton and Bedfordshire. She is a CASC examiner.

The team (including staffing) / service description

Luton and South Bedfordshire CRHT offer home treatment as an alternative to hospital admission for adults who have acute and severe mental illness. We work with many different agencies and get referrals from a number of different sources, both within healthcare, from individuals and families, and from other support agencies. The team work 365 days a year, 24 hours a day. The main sources of referral are the adult in patient wards, primary care, CMHTs, psychiatric liaison, addictions services and primary care psychology. You will have the opportunity to work closely with members of our multidisciplinary team, including the team psychologist, social workers and nurses. You will also be supported by the other doctors in the team – we have another consultant and an associate specialist permanently based in the team as well as a specialty trainee.

Role of the Specialty Trainee (ST4-6) / Main Duties and Responsibilities

The post-holder will provide a clinical psychiatric service, including assessing new referrals and drawing up biopsychosocial care plans, assessing the response to treatment of existing patients, and will get ample experience of writing comprehensive risk assessments. You will also get experience of planning and writing appropriate referrals to other services, for example to both primary and secondary care psychology, to CMHTs and for admission to in patient wards. You will be expected to contribute to our twice weekly comprehensive multidisciplinary team meetings where we discuss each patient in detail and formulate appropriate care plans. You can also have experience of presenting to and chairing meetings under consultant supervision and chairing MDT meetings when the consultant is on leave. The team has an educational programme which you will be expected to contribute to and you will also be expected to join/lead QI projects within the team. There are other teaching opportunities within the team and in Luton/Beds – we have Cambridge medical students attached to the team and you can get involved in running tutorials for medical students; you will also be expected

to contribute to the local academic programme, chairing and presenting cases/ journal clubs. You will also be expected to support and educate GP and CT trainees attached to the team.
